Supplement to RRS Appendix S: Standard Sailing Instructions

Competitors are reminded of rules added or changed in the NoR, especially:

- *RRS Appendix S (Standard Sailing Instructions);*
- *RRS Appendix T (Arbitration);*
- *Change in Class Rule 27(d) (Fleets, Starts and Sail Switching).*

1. RULES – adds to SI

1.2. [NP] Competitors shall not throw trash overboard. Trash will be received from boats by race committee vessels.

1.3. [DP] While in the race area, each boat shall display a coloured band identifying the competitor's division on the mast between the vang tang and the gooseneck. The colour of the band, which will be provided by the organizing authority, will be:

green for Apprentices,

red for Masters,

blue for Grand Masters,

yellow for Great Grand Masters, and

purple for Legends

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS – adds to SI

2.3. The official notice board is located in the clubhouse on the windows on the West side of the clubhouse outside the registration room.

2.4. The regatta office is located in the Bruce Nuke in the clubhouse.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE – adds SI 4.3, changing RRS Signal AP.

4.2. The flagpole is the mast located by the harbour entrance.

4.3. When flag AP is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 45 minutes" in the RRS race signal AP.

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES – adds to SI 5.1 and changes SI 5.2

5.1.Scheduled races:

5.2.To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with multiple sounds at least one minute before a warning signal is made. This changes SI 5.2.

6. CLASS FLAGS

6.1.This changes SI 6.1. The Class Flag for the fleet will be:

- Laser Standard (ILCA 7)– White flag with ILCA logo

7. THE COURSES

7.2.Only the courses shown in the diagrams (not to scale) will be sailed. The race committee will designate the course by displaying a number, before the warning signal. This changes SI 7.2.

7.3.The marks and the order in which they are to be passed are as follows:

7.3.1. Marks 1 and 1a are to be passed to port.

7.3.2. Marks 2s and 2p form a gate between which boats are to pass.

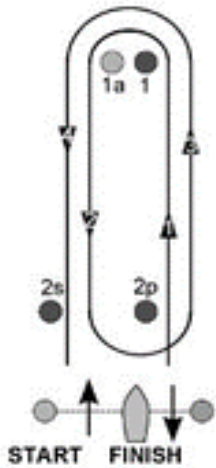
7.4.The course to be sailed will be designated by a numeral flag displayed with the warning signal.

7.5.If either mark 1 or mark 1a is missing, it will be removed from the rounding order.

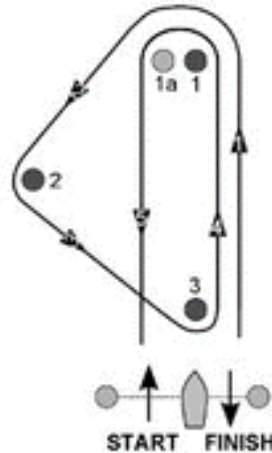
7.6.If Mark 1 is replaced because of a change of course, Mark 1a is removed from the rounding order.

7.7.If either Mark 2s or mark 2p is missing, the remaining mark will be rounded to port.

9. MARKS

Start Mark	1, 1A, 2S, 2P Marks	Finish Mark	NEW Marks (as in 10.1)
Pole mark with orange flag or Staff with orange flag in RC vessel	Orange Inflatables	Pole mark with blue flag or Staff with blue flag in RC vessel	Yellow Inflatables

12. TIME LIMITS

12.2. Boats failing to start within the Start Window will be scored DNS.

12.3. Limits:

Start Window	Mark 1	Race Time Limit	Finishing Window
4 minutes	20 minutes	60 minutes	20 minutes

12.4. Finishing on Course: The Race Committee may, at its discretion, award a placing to a boat before it has finished a race that corresponds to the boat's position in the race at the time the award is made. The Race Committee determines the method and order. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.
